Dear Mr MacSporran QC

Re William Theodore (Bill) D'Arcy Argos Police Task Force and others

I refer to the Fourth Trial: of William Theodore D'Arcy - 24 May 2004. I attach for your action a copy of an affidavit by Marie Doyle, fellow teacher with Bill D'Arcy at the Logan Village School. Marie Doyle describes the accusations of XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX as impossible. She does so on the Youtube video (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=u6jkYA8jwfl), found also on the Bill D'Arcy website (http://www.apersonalhistory.com/Bill_D'Arcy/) and also in this Affidavit which she asserted she wished to compose and sign of her own spontaneous volition.

This particular trial was compromised from the beginning. Then living in Darwin, XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX identified teacher Marie Doyle as a witness to her alleged assault, advising police she believed Doyle had died. Much later on, a police constable rang Marie Doyle to find her very much alive, and also found

out that she had no knowledge of any assault. Marie Doyle, as evidenced in the video, and the attached Affidavit, is still outraged by the D'Arcy conviction.

Inexplicably, D'Arcy's defence lawyers, did not allow Professor D. Thomson (who had flown up from Melbourne to Darwin), an expert witness on "recovered memory", to give evidence.

D'Arcy was found guilty on XXXXXX's ancient uncorroborated assertions -- and six months was added to his sentence.

A particular item of note is that XXXXXXXXXX's daughter had earlier been in a similar situation and had received \$50,000 victim compensation.

I enclose the affidavit and ask once again that a full, independent and careful enquiry be undertaken into the Bill D'Arcy case - especially its political origins, and the then relationship between certain ALP politicians and the Courier Mail.
